- Create awareness regarding role to be played by consumers in shaping an effective competition regime

Why on 5th December?

 The United Nations (UN) General Assembly formally adopted the UN Set of Competition Principles at its 35th meeting on 5th December 1980



 2nd call was made to observe the Day on 5th December based on a theme 'Cartels and their Harmful Effects on Consumers' which was mentioned on various renowned platforms such as:
